Chaplaincy Update



The month of the Holy Rosary has been an eventful month of prayer at All Saints, with Year 7s attending Rosary Prayers in the Chapel at break, volunteering to lead and learning about the mysteries associated with each decade.

Year 8 students have been leading the Rosary in Polish and Portuguese with the responses being said in English.

All Saints families joined the Torchlight Procession at St Mary of the Angels in Batley, led by Fr Paul Grogan and hosted by Fr Eamonn. Many schools and parishes from across the Diocese were represented by the participants in the procession. We joined together in saying the Rosary, singing Ave Maria and in Exposition in the Church.



Year Group Masses

We welcomed Fr John and Fr Sean to celebrate the Year Masses this half term.

Families joined us for the Year 7 Welcome Mass where a number of the students participated through reading, writing the prayers and altar serving.

Oscar and Isaac in Year 7 have altar served for all the Year Masses. We are really proud of them for finding the courage to serve for the older year groups.



Adoration

Twice this half term, we have opened the Chapel for silent prayer in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament.

The first time, we joined with the Parish in the Quarant D'or, the forty hours of Adoration in response to the Bishops Blessed Sacrament Conference, by holding forty minutes of Adoration.

We then had a full day where over sixty staff and students were able to rest in the Lord through silent prayer.

Once again, All Saints had the pleasure of welcoming the Lourdes Youth Section as the hosts of the Lourdes Reunion in September.

We gathered to share our memories and special moments from the Pilgrimage. We were transported back to Lourdes through the videography of Lily from the Youth Service who spent the Pilgrimage capturing every moment in film and photographs. We enjoyed spotting ourselves and the familiar events.

Mass was celebrated by Fr Marc Homsey and our altar servers were joined by servers from St Wilfred's. At the end of Mass, All Saints students, including Year 10 students hoping to join the 2025 Pilgrimage, recreated an Envoi as is usual after the final Mass, with bunting and streamers lining the exit from the Sports Hall.

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Introducing The Luce Room

The Luce Room (pronounced lou-chay) is a chaplaincy and wellbeing room for students and staff.

There have already been a good number of students who visit at breaks and lunches who are involved in chaplaincy planning, charity endeavours or just spending time together.

More students are now involved in chaplaincy because of The Luce Room.

Luce means light and the choice of room name comes from Blessed Chiara Badano (October 29, 1971 - October 7, 1990), an Italian teenager who has been beatified by the Roman Catholic Church. At age nine she joined the Focolare Movement and received the nickname "Luce" ("light") by the founder Chiara Lubich. Chiara dedicated her short life to being a reflection of the light of Christ and aiming to meet the needs of others.

Staff are also welcome to pop in for a cuppa and a listening ear.

Mrs Rhys-Hill looks forward to welcoming students or staff into The Luce Room if they are in need of a little light in their day.



Early Closure

Important

As we approach winter it is really important that you ensure instructions for your child/children in case of early school closure are clear on EduLink.

This allows us to release your child in the most appropriate way should school close early due to bad weather.

Please ensure your preference has been selected by Monday, 18th November.

Further to the early closure of school due to snow earlier this year, we took feedback from both our staff and parental emails that we received. We have updated our Early Closure Consent options as follows.

New Early Closure Consent Options:

The following options are now available to select from on EduLink. Please only select ONE option. Multiple selections will not be accepted as they cause confusion and could delay the release of your child. Please consider mirroring your selection for each sibling in school.

Wait to be collected from reception (please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

Your child will remain in their form room until you arrive in to reception to collect them.

Leave site and make their own way home (this includes walking home, going to someone else's house, using public transport, being collected by car on the main road)

Please do not drive on to the school site as we cannot guarantee your safety in poor weather conditions. School parking permit guidance still applies.

Wait for school bus/make their own way home (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child can make their own way home)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will be released to make their own way home. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens.

'Make their own way home' for this option includes the same examples as above.

Wait for school bus/wait to be collected (if the school bus is cancelled/delayed my child must wait to be collected – please collect within 30 minutes of the notification)

We will advise parents/carers of the expected bus arrival time when we message you to inform you about the closure.

If the bus is cancelled or the bus is delayed to a time after school needs to close, your child will wait to be collected. We will send a message to parents/carers to inform you if this happens. Please collect your child within 30 minutes of the notification.

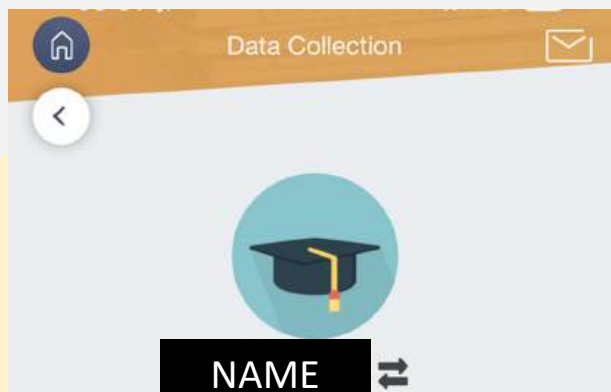

EduLink Early Closure Consent Updates

Please follow the guidance below to update your child's Early Closure Consent details using EduLink.

If you are using the EduLink One App

- Select the 'update information' purple button, it will take you to this screen:



- Press on the 2 arrows to move between your name and the name(s) of your child/ren
- Once you have selected your child's name, scroll down to the bottom of the page to the Travel and Parental Consent sections.
- Ensure the details in the Travel section are correct.
- In the Parental Consent section, select one of the four Early Closure Consent options in the drop-down box at the very bottom of the page.
- Scroll back to the top of the page and press save.
- You will need to follow this guidance for each child in school.

If you are logging into EduLink online

- Select the 'update information' purple button.
- A new screen will appear with your name and your child/ren's name(s) in the left-hand column. Your name will be highlighted in blue.
- Select your child's name – this should now turn blue. Scroll down to the bottom of the page to the Travel and Parental Consent sections.
- Ensure the details are correct in the Travel section.
- In the Parental Consent section, select one of the four Early Closure Consent options in the drop-down box at the very bottom of the page.
- Click on the green save button at the bottom of the page.
- You will need to follow this guidance for each child in school.

For families with more than one child at All Saints, we ask you to consider mirroring your consent preference for each child.

We also ask that you discuss with your children whether they will make their way home together in the event of an early closure and if so, they agree a meeting point either out the front of school or at the top of the drive/bus waiting area. This may already be something that they do at the end of a normal school day.

All EduLink users have the option to be able to update consents.

European Day of Languages 2024: Languages for Peace



Throughout Europe, 700 million Europeans are represented in the Council of Europe's 46 member states and all are encouraged to discover more languages at any age, as part of or alongside their studies. This stems from the Council of Europe's conviction that linguistic diversity is a tool for achieving greater intercultural understanding and a key element in the rich cultural heritage of our continent. The Council of Europe, therefore, promotes plurilingualism throughout Europe.

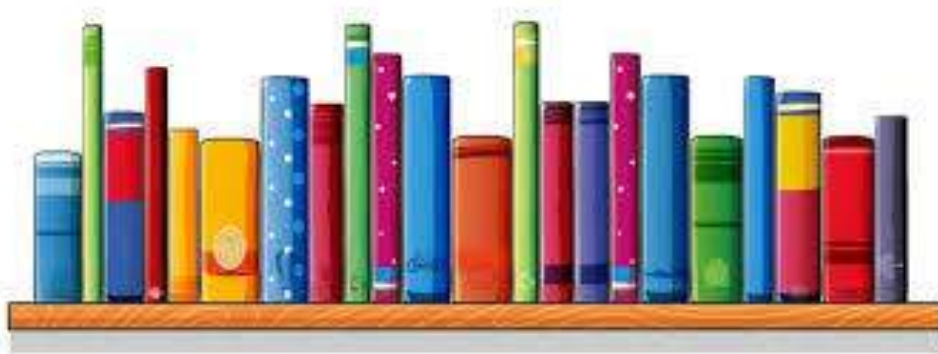

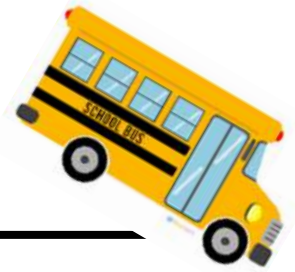

SERVICE C78 ROUTE

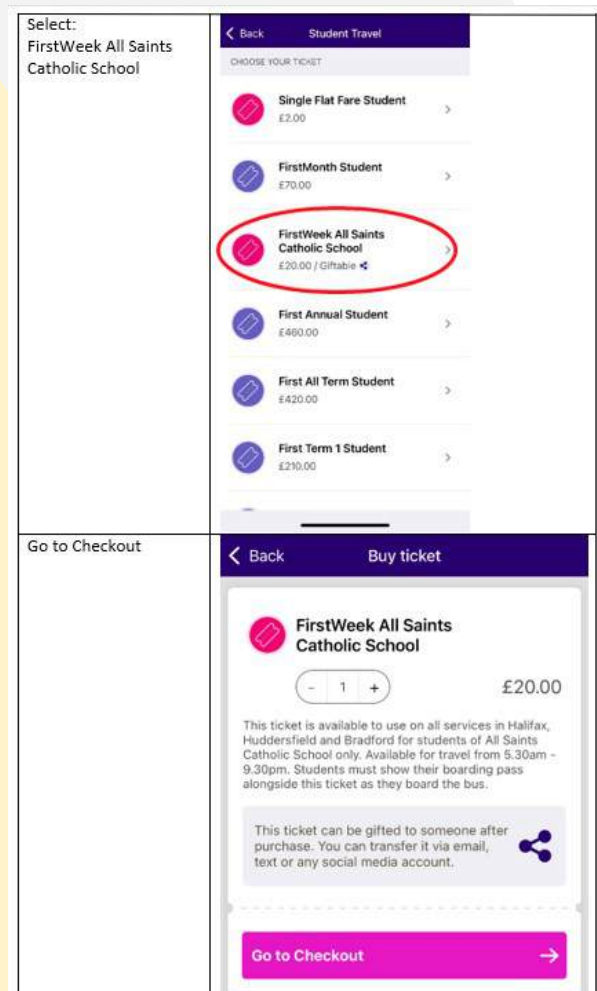
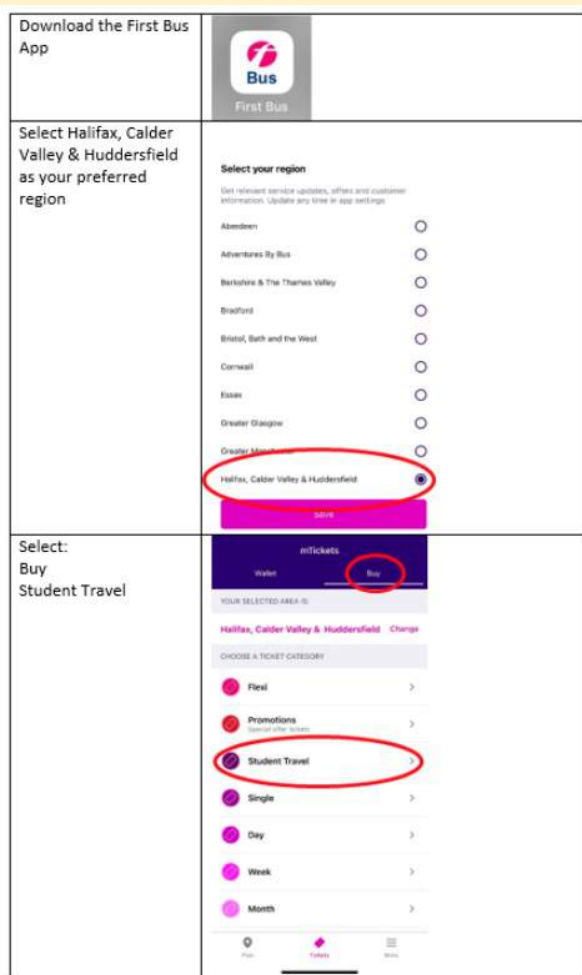
For those using the C78 bus route to and from Calderdale, please note that the Metro Card is not a valid form of payment for this service.

The school will be regularly checking students' passes to ensure compliance with this rule. It is crucial that everyone adheres to these guidelines to avoid risking the loss of this vital transport service for our students.

Thank you for your cooperation in helping us maintain this service.

If you wish to use the C78 service you must either:

- pay £2 cash per journey or
- purchase an All Saints Weekly Ticket - please follow the instructions below:



Once you have purchased the pass you can send it via email, text or social media account to your child.
Once you have purchased this ticket, your child can travel on all First Bus services from 5:30am – 9:30pm in Halifax, Huddersfield and Bradford.

EduLink One Communication

A polite reminder of our preferred communication channel between parents/carers and the school. This system allows us to support you in monitoring your child's progress, updating us with contact and medical information, receiving communications from school, booking after-school activities, and most recently, booking appointments for parents' evenings.

The transition to EduLink One has been success although we still have a small number of parents/carers who are yet to activate their account. We encourage you to do this as soon as possible to ensure you are not missing out on important information and opportunities for your children.

EduLink One is free to access on any modern web enabled device, either via www.edulinkone.com on a web browser on PCs, laptops, tablets and mobile devices or, with the dedicated app on Android or iOS.

You are eligible to access EduLink One if you are a parent/carer with parental responsibility for a student at All Saints Catholic College. If you have more than one child at the school, you will only require one account. You will need the following information to log in:

School ID	You can either use ASCC or HD22JT
Username	You will receive an email with your username details.
Password	You can change your password once you have logged in.

Log in details have been sent to the email address you have already provided to school from edulink@aschc.com. Please check your junk mail if you have not received this.

If you require any support or advice getting EduLink One setup, please email:

You can access your child's details, timetable, attendance, behaviour, achievement points, book your parent evening appointments and secure your child's after-school club place(s). All messages, notifications and emails are now sent to parents/carers through EduLink. Please ensure you turn on notifications for the app to ensure you do not miss any messages. Only urgent whole school messages will be sent by text, all other messages will be sent as push notifications through the app - these will appear as pop-ups on your device.

The only other service parents/carers will need to make use of is ParentPay for paying for school lunches, trips and purchasing other items such as ties, calculators and revision materials.

Students can now access this system with their own school log in details, but cannot use this to secure their place for after-school clubs and events. This must be done by a parent/carer using their own log in details.

The change will take place for the Admissions round for 2026–2027. The following shows the current and proposed criteria overview, full policy is on our website.
